A school kit contains a school bag with notebooks, fully equipped pencil or geometry boxes and other educational aides such writing pad, drawing kit, etc.. The School Kit program is a program, which helps socially conscious people to contribute back to society. Many of us have experienced the joy of having new school bags, books, pencil, geometry boxes on the very first day of the school. Through this initiative we aim to create the same happiness for the underprivileged children.

The theme 'Bring a Smile' - a philanthropic initiative started in 2012 in Hyderabad was taken up by HDFC this year as a CSR (Corporate Social Responsibility) initiative. Each one of the HDFC life, Chiplun team under the leadership of branch manager, Mr. Nilesh Mallik contributed in this initiative by

making available the stationery. books & learning tools that children would love to. They also displayed the collected material at office desk and made an appeal to all the HDFC life stakeholders to contribute in the initiative.

Children were very delighted and that was the outcome of "Bring a Smile" initiative. It was not just a stationery material for the children and community members but it was a warm hand holding support for their children.

Since time immemorial, women have played, and continue to play, a key role in conservation of basic life support system, such as, land, water, flora and fauna. Rural women play a crucial role in agricultural development and allied fields, including crop production, livestock production, horticulture, post-harvest operations, fisheries, etc. Without total intellectual and physical participation of women, it is not possible to achieve the goals of rural development. Hence, deliberate actions are taken to get engaged in their capacity building especially on health and livelihood.

It has been observed that interactions with women not only facilitate their capacity building but it also provides positive insights for the activities that need to be initiated. Although the present engagement of Dishantar with women is limited, we are hoping to initiate a sustained and long term engagement on this wing.

Adishakti activities are aligned directly with Dishantar's vision of "Patriot, Knowledgeable, Ethical and Progressive Society. The activities create a space for girls to interact on their issues, the way they want to be. It instills confidence and better hope for the future in the eyes of the girls. It has been observed that the rural girls lack knowledge about menstrual hygiene and the issues adversely affect their menstrual health. Hence, this year, we have started dissemination of sanitary napkins in the girls' workshop as a starting point on awareness about menstrual health.

Follow up initiatives are ongoing and part and parcel of Dishantar's regular activities. This year there were 2 significant achievements as far as Nirbade tribal hamlet is concerned. One is availability of Rupe Cards and POS service on the hamlet in support with Bank of India, Chiplun branch and the other is sanction of funds from Zillah Parishad for rejuvenation of well that is the major source of water for the hamlet. Supporting Vishwasda, eminent leader from tribal hamlet of Nirbade for getting his wife operated for Cancer was indeed an important task and bravo to get her recovered soon. Overall, this year was more sweet than salt for Nirbade hamlet.

SUJAL PROJECT

Underprivileged community becomes the first victim of the water-borne diseases due to lack of proper hygiene and sanitation. Every year they suffer from water transmitting diseases like cholera, typhoid, hepatitis A and dysentery amounting to expenses around 2500 per family. Being economically weaker, diseases increase the borrowings of the community and they have to miss their daily wages too.

Hence, there was a need to provide domestic water purifiers (DWPs). DOMINION DIAMOND (INDIA) PRIVATE LIMITED, (a private company limited by shares incorporated under the Companies Act, 1956) supported Dishantar and made available funds for Sujal Project, a project for safe drinking water to 100 underprivileged community households.

Making the DWPs available was not a difficult task but making the plan successful and sustainable was a difficult task as we had to intervene in the day to day life of the community and make them cultured enough to follow the better hygienic practices at household level. This initiative was a step towards bringing health and joy to 100 underprivileged rural households, enabling and empowering them to improve their quality of life, offering them independence from the water borne diseases and providing substantial fiscal savings to them.
