

Highlights:

Pandemic Response Activities:

Pandemic situation of Covid-19 has created havoc in the entire world. Most underprivileged were the most vulnerable in this situation. Hence considering the lockdown situation and its adverse effect on livelihood of the underprivileged daily wage labors, grocery kits were made available to 70 deprived families in remote areas of Ovli, Kalkavne and Nirbade villages from Chiplun block of Ratnagiri. Awareness about the pandemic and the possible pandemic management at household level as well as community level were discussed with local animators.

Annapurna Activities:

This was the fifth year of Annapurna project. Although there was no funding support for activities in Vehele and Moravne, the projects have been marching towards self-sustainability. Ongoing refreshers' trainings, workshops on new flagship programmes and enhanced rapport with the potential consumers have given boost to this project. Project target groups realized the significance of Annapurna activities during the pandemic as there was almost lockdown over a period of more than 9 months and people found it difficult to earn their livelihood. Agriculture was perhaps the only livelihood activity which had a very mild economic shock due to pandemic. This has positively encouraged members to focus on the project activities. This year project area was more than 82 acres, agriculture production was around 370 tons and market value of the produce was around Rs. 96 Lakhs. These figures itself are sufficient to interpret the project achievement.







Mandavkhari:

This was the second year of the project in Mandavkhari in partnership with Kansai Nerolac Paints Ltd.. Holding regular meetings was a tool to promote and facilitate communication and build trust within the group members. Kitchen gardens were instrumental in increasing household income either by sale of the food products grown in the gardens or by the consumption of the same food items that the families would have otherwise purchased from markets using a significant portion of the family income. This year Kaalkidevi women farmers' group has initiated activity of Mushroom production which served as an additional income generating tool. Exposure visit has enhanced rapport with Fruit Research center. Women got information about much advancement in agriculture and horticulture field as well as livelihood activities based on it.

This year Mr. Pankaj Korde from ATMA, Mr. Vinayak Mahajan from Kudavale, Dapoli guided the project activities especially field activities. Project area was 17 acres, agriculture production was around 21.29 tons and market value of the produce was around Rs. 5.3 Lakhs.







Constraint:

Hailstorm hit some parts of Chiplun taluka on 11th February 2021. After that, the temperature rose by 40 degrees Celsius between March 19 and 23. Over the next few days, it began to fluctuate dramatically. E.g. the temperature was 18 degrees at night and 38 degrees during the day. In contrast to cloudy weather and extreme heat and subsequent rains, the crop of cabbage, hybrid pea and cauliflower was completely destroyed or eliminated. Eggplant, tomato, cucumber in the second stage and watermelon in the third stage were completely damaged.

Udaan Activities:

Udaan project has strengthened the entrepreneurial base for the existing SHGs engaged in entrepreneurial activities and new individual as well as groups were linked with Udaan activities. This year entrepreneurial activities of selling value added food products (ragi malt, papads, pickles, flours, vermicelli, etc.) were carried out successfully by Udaan project. Women entrepreneurs participated in exhibition-cum-sale in Ratnagiri Grahak Peth and sold food products worth Rs. 26000/-









Dnyanyadnya Activities:

- Course Book Bank for Junior College Students
 This year Dishantar has made available 1530 course books worth Rs.155517/- to
 200 students from 6 junior colleges from rural Ratnagiri.
- Scholarship for Higher Education

This year scholarship for Rs. 690,000/-has been made available to 129 students from Ratnagiri district. Tata Education and Development Trust have made available financial support. This was the third year of sustained support by Trust.

Liaisoning with BARC:

Under the framework of DAE societal initiative, AKRUTI Tech Plus (ATP) has been designed and offered to encourage and promote techno-preneurship for deployment of technologies exclusively in Rural and semi-Urban sector. Dishantar had applied to utilize AKRUTI Tech Plus to demonstrate, deploy and adapt BARC technologies to create sustainable and income generating activities for rural communities. Dishantar has taken ATP for following selected technologies:

- 1. Rapid Bio-compost A rapid composting technology for decomposition of vegetative waste.
- 2. Fruit Cubes Process for long lasting ready to eat (RTE) Intermediate Mois ture Fruit Cubes
- 3. VTD Vibro Thermal Disinfestor
- 4. SD Solar Dryer





Liaisoning with NABARD:

Ratnagiri District Development Manager of NABARD, Ms. Shraddha Hajirnis had visited Annapurna project on 22nd February 2021. She had a farm visit, interface with women farmers and discussion with Dishantar team regarding activities of Dishantar. She had briefed the team and farmers about the latest scheme of NABARD and the ongoing initiatives in the district and state on lines of natural resource based livelihood. Her sensitive and concerned words have built farmers' confidence.

Liaisoning with Manav Sadhan Vikas Sanstha (MSVS):

MSVS has been implementing a unique model called the Parivartan Kendra Model- for the sustainable development of the country's backward regions for more than a decade and a half. MSVS facilitates the human resource in the under-developed regions to become economically self-reliant and empowered. It employs a community-led, participatory approach to development, and relies on community participation and creation of strong local relationships with all the stakeholders in the area. Dishantar has been engaged in grass root activities of MSVS in Ratnagiri district through Parivartan Kendra Ratnagiri.

This year MSVS has brought a new women empowerment project which aims at provision of bicycles' bank at school level for school going girls of std. 8 to 10 and provision of sewing machines to set up units of 10 skilled tailors. Accordingly provision for Chiplun block was for 200 bicycles' bank in 20 schools and 200 sewing machines for 20 skilled tailor units. MSVS delegation had visited intervened area of Dishantar for beneficiary verification. They had discussions with school authorities as well as women members from various groups. Hopefully, this project gets completed by next year.



Training programme on Gender (04 to 06 Jan 2021 & 16 to 18 March 2021):

SAMYAK – A Communication and Resource Centre organized a training programme 'Saksham Grameen Patrakaar, Maharashtra-1 &2' with 27 rural print and electronic journalists from 9 districts of Maharashtra and from Goa. This was the second batch. It was on Gender, Patriarchy, Sexual and Reproductive Health and Rights (SRHR) and Access to Safe Abortion. It was organized in collaboration with the Department of Journalism and Mass Communication of Mumbai University. Mr. Rajesh Joshte and Mrs. Seema Yadav participated in the training. It helped to sharpen the vision of Dishantar team for women empowerment activities.



Virtual Training programme on sustainable rural livelihood (03 to 05 March 2021):

Objective of the training was to understand the concept of livelihood systems, list out different approaches, opportunities and practices of rural livelihoods and understand the functioning of various peoples' institutes in this regard. Discussions were held about

- Poverty Reduction Programmes Lessons, Experience sharing
- Sustainable Livelihoods Approach (SLA)- Core concepts and practices
- ♦ Vulnerability issues in SLA
- Empowerment of social groups Participatory approach for SLA
- ♦ Policies, institutions and processes in SLA SHG, JLGs and Second tier institutions
- ♦ Financing for livelihood activities
- ♦ NRLM/LEDP

Study Tour (16-17 Feb 2021):

A study tour is a unique travel experience that combines learning with travelling. Vengurla Regional Fruit Research Centre of Kokan Krushi Vidyapith, 35 acres private farm of Mr. Prakash Desai in Banda and Konkan Bamboo and Cane Development Center (KONBAC) were the places visited. 22 women farmers participated in study tour having exposure of fruit plant nurseries, fruit processing unit, fruit orchard development system and bamboo processing activities. Women enjoyed being away from household chores, responsibilities and enjoyed their space with fellow Annapurna members.







Achievements:

- Annapurna project has covered area of 99.7 acres in round the year farming this year
 with a production of 393.72 tons with a market value of Rs. 101.66 lakhs and its out
 come are fascinating various People Organizations. Model is also being preferred for
 learning and replication.
- 20 Families who have actively participated in demonstration of Kitchen Garden activity have gained additional average income of Rs.34,420/- per family and those who have additionally taken mushroom production activity have gained Rs. 46,920/- in a year.
- Udaan project has boosted up confidence of women entrepreneurs. 67 women are engaged in entrepreneurial activities and they have started earning average income of around Rs. 72000/- per year.



Eminent Visitors to Annapurna Project:

Annapurna project and its outcome are fascinating various People Organizations. Model is also being preferred for learning and replication. Some organizations are interested in appreciating the Annapurna members to boost their morale towards achievement of sustainable development goal.

Visit of Ex-Union Cabinet Minister:

Ex-Union Cabinet Minister for Heavy Industries and Public Sector Enterprises during 2014 - 2019 in Narendra Modi cabinet – Mr. Anant Geete visited Annapurna project. He had visited Annapurna Farm and had informal discussions with team Annapurna. While addressing farmers he expressed his urge for agriculture development and need for replication of Annapurna in other parts of Kokan region.





Visit of Block Development Officer & Extension officers from Chiplun:

Mr. Prashant Raut, B.D.O. Chiplun had visited Annapurna project with more than 75 block and village level officials from line departments. Village secretaries and extension officers were amongst the visitors. Mr. Raut had an objective to make line department field employees aware about the possible round the year farming options available in the region and possibility of its replication in their intervention area. He appreciated the effort of Dishantar and small and marginal women farmers. Village secretaries and extension officers' representatives shared thoughts about appreciation of Annapurna and its replication in their intervened area.







Visit of Bharatiya Stree Shakti Members:

Bharatiya Stree Shakti (voluntary, autonomous, apolitical organization committed to empowering women, families and the society at large) visited Annapurna project. 11 members from BSS visited Mandavkhari farm, had discussions with Annapurna members and honored them with token of appreciation for their efforts. This visit helped build alliance with BSS.



Project Monitoring Visit by Team Nerolac:

Visit by Team Nerolac has always been a booster dose for empowerment. This time visitors were Mr. Santosh Deshmukh – Sr. HR Manager, Mr. Amol Deokar – HR Manager, Lote and Mr. Nandan Surve – Executive HR. Team members noted the positive changes in the Annapurna members' personalities. They appreciated the same. Field visit accompanied by group discussion was the schedule of the visit. Monitoring team has acknowledged the efforts of Dishantar team for the project activities and women empowerment process.

Recognitions:

- ABP Maza and Lokshahi: Marathi news channels broadcasted coverage of Annapurna project at Vehele. Highlight of the coverage was achievement of small and marginal women farmers.

It was a proud moment for the entire team of Annapurna. This was for the first time all these 3 members were sharing stage with eminent women leaders.
- Dishantar has taken a step forward on the front of rural development and women empowerment by participating in AKRUTI Tech Plus programme of B.A.R.C..
